





Set along one of west London's liveliest thoroughfares, this five-bedroom home retreats behind an impressive stucco frontage, its calm interior at gentle odds with the bustle beyond. Past the cast-iron gate and neutral front door, the house spans five luminous storeys, each one revealing hints to its architectural heritage.


The open-plan kitchen and dining room sets the tone: tall ceilings edged with decorative roses and cornicing, a south-facing sash window drawing sunlight across oak floorboards and a marble fireplace. Folding doors lead through to the kitchen, where period detailing meets farmhouse cabinetry, integrated appliances and a double sink. From the same floor, a tranquil terrace garden unfolds – mature shrubbery and boundary walls create a private leafy sanctuary.


Back inside and ascending to the first floor, a double reception room creates a distinguished setting for entertaining, its twin fireplaces and ornate mouldings enhancing the sense of occasion. Light pours in from sash windows at both ends, while an adjoining space – framed by an arched doorway and wrapped in glazing – offers an ideal spot for a quiet moment over a morning coffee. Below, the lower ground floor is home to a relaxed family room, finished with polished parquet flooring and opening onto a sunroom with a glass roof and generous storage.




















The principal bedroom occupies much of the second floor, defined by full-height wardrobes along one wall and bespoke shelving opposite. A second bedroom overlooks the garden, both served by a refined shower room with twin basins and a Victorian heated towel rail. Two further bedrooms sit beneath the eaves on the third floor, one airy and elevated with rooftop views, the other with custom bunks and characterful beams. A family bathroom with a freestanding roll-top bath completes this level.

A final bedroom, with its own fireplace, is found on the lower ground floor alongside a separate shower room and private courtyard access – rounding off a home that balances heritage features, thoughtful design and urban convenience.






